



Making Sense of Neurodivergence Training for Early Career Teachers (ECTs)



Around 1 in 5 school pupils are considered neurodivergent yet frameworks for teacher training and development do not currently include mandatory neurodiversity training.

This module offers an introduction to understanding neurodivergence and areas of strength and difference, including: Social Understanding and Communication, Flexibility, Information Processing and Understanding and Sensory Processing and Integration. Initial reasonable adjustments are considered for supporting neurodivergent pupils, including the creation and use of a One-Page Profile.

This module is designed to support teachers in the early stages of their careers who want to deepen their understanding of neurodivergence.
