This training would benefit all school staff and governors supporting children and young people in mainstream or specialist settings.

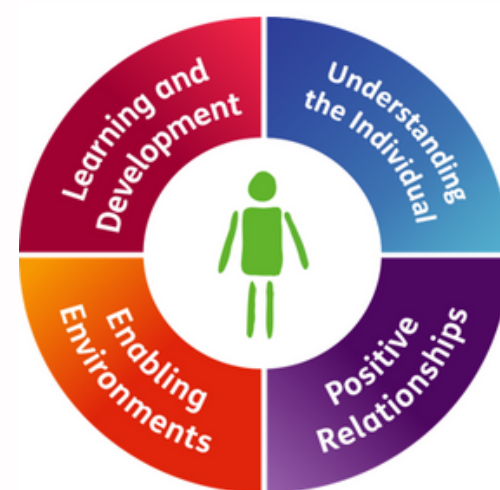
Training Format:

The GAP training can either be delivered as a half PD day (3 hours) or as two 1.5 hours twilights.

- Strategies to reduce barriers and support neurodivergent pupils
- Practical tools to create inclusive learning environments
- Ways to promote wellbeing, autonomy and belonging for all learners

Cost A	Standards and Competency Framework, GAP training, Neuroinclusive Practice Network (3/year)	£550
Cost B	If another school (including Standards Framework and Neuroinclusive Practice Network for each school 3/year)	+ £50 / school
Cost C	If over 50 trainees (additional trainers needed)	+ £100

Cost includes the training delivered in school, a follow up session in school to work on using the Standards and Competency Frameworks, plus invitation to join the Shropshire Neuroinclusive Practice Network (3 times/year).
